Dog Breeds



Akita:

Large dog, 50 to 75 lbs. Curled tail and smallish ears as compared to head, which will sometimes dip forward to touch the tops of the eyes. Colors.. White, brindle, white/brown.

Alert and responsive, usually aggressive towards other dogs.



Alaskan Malamute :

75 to 85 lbs, same smallish ears as Akita, but stands straight up. Curled tail (unless afraid) Colors.... Always white on the face and under the body, can be tan or grey throughout the top of the body. Usually friendly, not just a one-man dog.



American Staffordshire terrier:

Heavy shouldered and neck, shorter legs and very muscular. 50 lbs on average. Can be any color but usually a white mix with tan or black. What many assume to be the 'pit bull', has a good temperament unless breed otherwise.



Bull Mastiff

LARGE dog, 100 to 130 lbs. Usually tan, dark brown or dark grey. A family companion and protector, so strangers should be careful.



Great Dane

At near 4 feet to the top of its head you will know a Great Dane immediately 'Marmaduke' is a regal, well balanced dog that is never timid, but rarely ever vicious. Colors are light tan to light brown, sometimes grey.



Siberian Husky:

Ranging from 35 to 60 lbs, the husky is like the Malamute and Akita, but without the curled tail, and most times has BLUE EYES. Friendly, unaggressive and usually not suspicious of strangers.



Staffordshire Bull Terrier:

Shorter than the American Staffordshire terrier, weighs about 28 to 40 lbs, but very muscular and very quick. Smooth coat and overly large JAW muscles, another nicknamed the 'put bull', and is very attatched to the owner, so strangers must take notice. Usually black, tan or liver colored.
